Voting in the 2020 Election

1. **Have you registered to vote?** If no, complete the voter registration form and send to the county auditor for the county you reside in.

2. **Since you last registered to vote**, has your name changed? Has your address changed?
If yes to either question, please complete the voter registration form and send to the county auditor.

3. Do you want to **vote by absentee ballot through the mail**?

Find the **absentee voting request form** [here](#):

Complete and send to the County Auditor for the county you live in.

SOS has a [tracking page](#) which shows when the county auditor receives your request for an absentee ballot.

Requests for absentee ballots **must be physically** in the office of your **County Auditor** by Saturday, **Oct. 24**.

Be sure all information is entered and entered correctly. Please provide your phone number and email address in case the County Auditor needs to follow up on the information on the [Request for absentee ballot form](#).

There is a **contact free drop box** in the lobby of the Polk County Election office at 120 2nd Avenue from 8AM to 4:30 PM – Monday through Friday.

4. **Absentee Ballots** will start to be mailed out by the County Auditor on **Monday, Oct. 5**.

When you receive an absentee ballot, follow the directions, complete the ballot, and send it back to the county auditor **without delay**.

Absentee ballots must be **postmarked by no later than Nov. 2**.

5. There will be no satellite voting locations.

6. There will be no drop boxes around the community – SOS has determined them to be illegal.

7. You can **vote early** at the County Auditor's office **starting Monday, Oct. 5**.

Voting at the County Auditor's office is also known as "**absentee ballot in-person voting**".

Voting can be done Monday through Friday 8 AM to 5 PM.at the County Auditor's office. The address of the Polk County Auditor's Election office is 120 2nd Avenue, Suite A, Des Moines 50309

The last two Saturdays prior to election day – the County Auditor's Election office will be open for voting.

Do I need to show an ID when I vote absentee in-person?

YES. Voters in Iowa are required to show an ID when voting absentee in-person and at the polls on election day.

What are valid forms of ID to show when voting absentee in-person or at the polls on election day?

- Iowa Voter Identification Card
- Iowa Driver's License
- Iowa Non-Operator ID
- U.S. Military ID or Veteran ID
- U.S. Passport
- Tribal ID Card/Document

A voter without one of the above forms of ID may have the voter's identity attested to by another registered voter in the precinct or may prove identity and residence using [Election Day Registration](#) documents.

8. Tuesday, Nov. 3 – Election

Vote at your designated polling place.The polling places are in the process of being confirmed. Contact the County Auditor's election office for your polling place - election@polkcountyiowa.gov

In summary – You can vote one of 3 ways - by:

1. **Absentee ballot – through the mail,**
2. **Absentee ballot –through in-person voting at the County Auditor's election office starting Oct. 5, or**
3. **Voting at a designated polling place on Tuesday, November 3**

The County Auditor's office will start counting absentee ballots on Monday, before the election on Tuesday, Nov. 3.

All absentee ballots must be counted by 10 PM on election night, Nov. 3

Executive Order 7 – Restoration of Citizen’s Rights

40-50,000 Iowans with felony records are now eligible to register and vote.

Everyone meeting these standards is eligible to vote and includes the right to run for office.

1. Must have completed their confinement, probation and parole.
2. It excludes felony crimes under Iowa Code Section 707 (homicide)
3. It does not require restitution to be paid

No paperwork is required.

The Sec of State (SOS) has a restoration of rights packet, if one is needed.
